Citizen Science is coming!

The **Big River Watch** is back and taking place over the Bank Holiday weekend (and the forecast says that the weather will be fabulous!)



Many of you took part last year and contributed to the 3,600 surveys that were completed. Hopefully, even more of us will take part this year so that we can deepen our understanding of the health of our rivers and work out how we can take better care of them.

Want to know how to take part?

- 1. **Download the free Big River Watch app**, available on both the <u>Apple App Store</u> and <u>Google Play</u>.
- 2. Take part! Visit your local river, or explore a new one, and spend 15 minutes observing and recording what you see in the simple in-app survey.
- 3. Press upload and share your findings.

Together, we'll gather vital data on everything from wildlife sightings to pollution levels. Not sure what you're seeing? Not to worry, our handy in-app guides will help you identify common species and different kinds of pollution.

What's more, you'll spend 15 meaningful minutes connecting with nature, so it's good for our rivers and for you. The perfect activity for a Bank Holiday weekend.

The Friends are promoting the 'Rethink Waste' campaign. This is our chance to get a share of £6000 and improve our environment. Read their section in the Newsletter to see how you can be involved. I easily earnt the school 300 points in less than 5 minutes!

We are also working with The Friends in planning our next Gardening Afternoon. On Friday 10th May we are inviting families in to tidy up/refresh/plant in our wonderful grounds. Parking

We have been made aware that, since start of this term, one of our school community has started parking in Oakdene Close to "drop off & pick up" as a matter of routine. We do ask that Oakdene Close is only used as a last resort or in an emergency. Unfortunately, it seems that other parents have noticed and now started doing the same and this is increasing the safety risk involved for the parents and children walking to and from the school at that time.

I understand that the request from the school emanates from a time when a child got hit and injured by a car coming up the Close to do a" drop off". The pavement was then widened so no one had to walk in the road. It is important to remind ourselves and the children that we must walk on the pavement and stop and check before crossing driveways.

Our request, not to park in Oakdene Close, is there to keep everyone safe and to minimise the disruption for local residents. Please do show respect by following our request.
